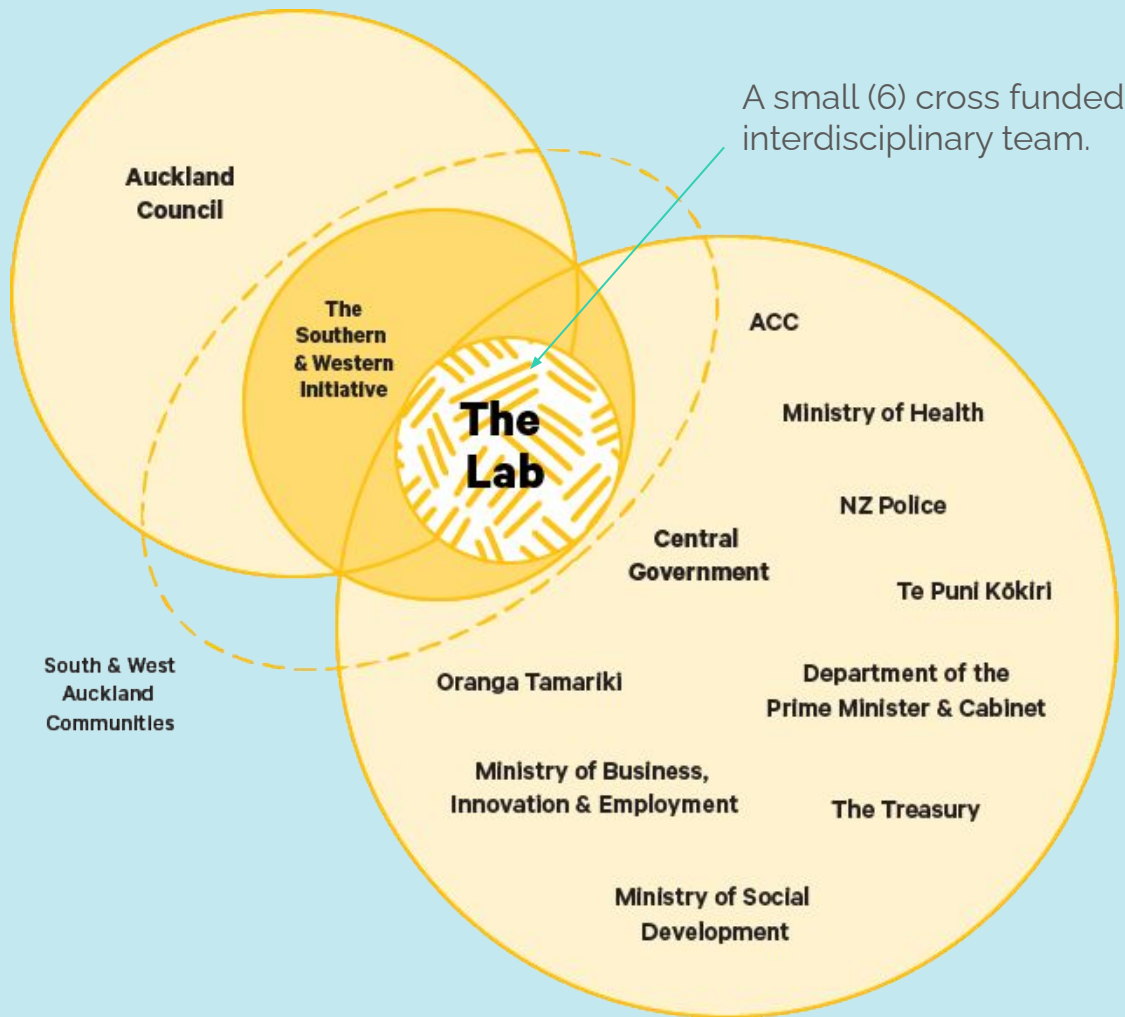
The Lab

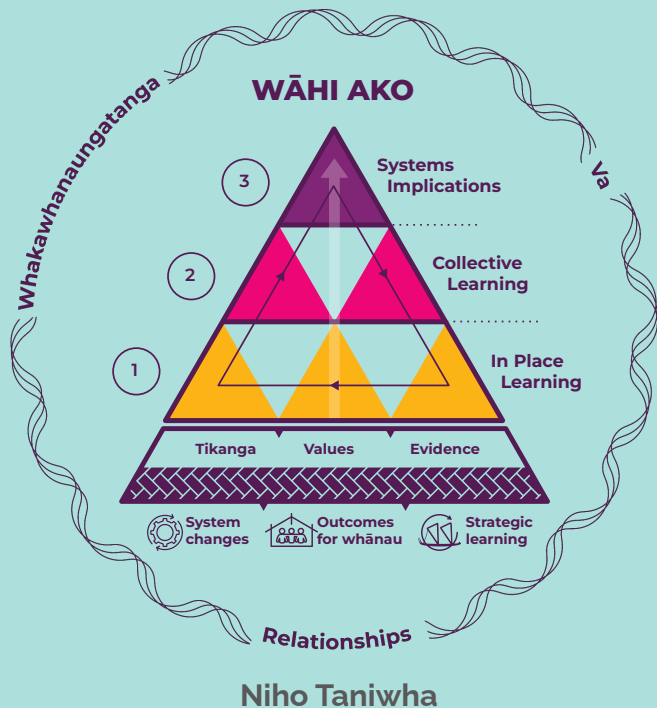
