Berlin University Alliance

The Berlin University Alliance is a consortium consisting of three major Berlin universities – Freie Universität Berlin, Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin, Technische Universität Berlin – and Charité – Universitätsmedizin Berlin. The four partners joined forces to further develop Berlin as a research hub with international drawing power.

Together the partners explore major societal challenges, increase public outreach, promote the training of junior researchers, address issues of quality and standards in research, and share research infrastructure. Furthermore, teaching, diversity, and internationalization are central fields of action and of high strategic importance.

The Berlin University Alliance is funded by the Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF) and the state of Berlin under the Excellence Strategy of the Federal Government and the Länder.

Altogether 1,700 professors, 100,000 students, 12,000 doctoral candidates, and 26,000 staff members conduct research, teach, study, and work within the alliance.
